

At the **Environmental Nature Center**, a few spots are still available for Spring Break Camp, which runs from April 10 - 13. Each day, campers will rotate between three camp teachers and participate in exciting, age-appropriate hands-on activities. Full and half day camps are open to youngsters from kindergarten through 6th grade. Among the activities are hiking through the nature center with Ms. Valerie to meet different groups of animals and learn about their habitats through art, science, dramatic and nature play; learn science projects that students can replicate at home with supervision and create crafts; discover honeybees and the important role they play in sustaining the successfulness of wild plants and crops; younger "full day" campers will grow Gummi worms and bears in a fun and educational science experiment, as well as participate in a group art project, go on a nature scavenger hunt, make shave ice and go on a walking field trip to Nektar Juice Bar, and older "full day" campers will get their hands dirty and learn how to make lots of different fun and interesting crafts – from slime to bottle rockets to paper beads. Costs: Full-day member, \$238; full-day non-member, \$265; half-day member, \$162; half-day non-member, \$180. Class ratio: 10 students per teacher with a high school assistant.
